Uniform Update

After receiving input from students, families and teachers the review group and the School Board have endorsed the following adjustments to the school uniform at Antonio starting in Term 1 2021:

- Active Uniform worn by students all week – this will be based on the sports uniform
- Source new options to replace the current rugby jumper and track pants due to challenges with wear and quality
- Wear predominantly white sports shoes to school with white socks

Early next term the review group which will include staff, families and students will look at options to replace the track pants and the rugby top that are importantly good quality, comfortable, affordable, look smart and suit both outside and inside learning activities for all students. There will be a transition time for all families to purchase the new track pants and rugby top replacement during the next year or so as your child grows out of their current pants and top. The polo shirt and shorts will remain the same along with the hat. More information will be sent home next term.

Planning for 2021

Thank you to everyone who has informed us of their intentions to continue at Antonio in 2021 through the online form in Seesaw. We are now planning class structures based upon the numbers of students we have at Antonio and we are looking forward to welcoming more Reception students and the children from Year 1 to Year 6 in the limited places we have available. We are becoming a school that is being sought for the improving learning and wellbeing outcomes for every student.

School Fees Reduction for 2021

Our School Finance Committee and School Board have worked closely with school leadership and Catholic Education SA to provide a reduction in school fees for all families at Antonio starting at the beginning of 2021. Our school is committed to be the **high quality, low fee education** option for families in our local area. Below are the new 2021 school fees in comparison to the 2020 fees which we also lowered from 2019:
