<u>SHROVE TUESDAY</u> is a major event on the Church liturgical calendar. It leads us into **LENT**. The practice of using up butter, eggs and honey before the time of fasting during **LENT** began as a Christian practice during the early, middle ages.

Many celebrations in today's world started as **LENTEN** celebrations for example; Mardi Gras and Carnivale both began as religious Shrove Tuesday celebrations in order to have a big party before the fasting began.

/Making pancakes and feasting before Easter became SHROVE TUESDAY.

In the Catholic Tradition this is the time for prayer, fasting and giving to the poor. The Church looks different during **LENT**. It is dressed in **PURPLE** the **LENTEN** colour of the **Liturgical Year of the Church**.

The Alleluia is not sung during these 40 days.

We celebrate **ASH WEDNESDAY** by attending a service to receive ashes on our forehead as a gesture of embracing a simple way of life, making good choices and raising awareness of others in need of help.


# SCHOOL CHAPLAIN



# **Support Towards Anxiety recovery**



Centacare's PACE service offers a free support group for people experiencing anxiety and panic attacks.

The STAR group provides a safe environment in which to:

- Meet other people experiencing similar challenges
- Share your experiences with people who understand what you are going through
- Learn strategies to help you in your recovery

PACE support groups are co-facilitated by a Peer Worker with a lived experience of recovery.

Anyone over the age of 16 can attend, and you are welcome to bring a support person with you.

If you have anxiety or panic attacks, the STAR group can help.
