By using this system, we aim to be in touch with you quicker in regard to any pressing matters during the break.

## **Attendance**

Research shows that continual attendance at school supports both short term and long-term student learning achievement and wellbeing. Children are able to continue to deepen their understandings of concepts on a daily basis and build and maintain friendships more successfully.

*If your child is going to be away from school*, we ask you to contact the front office to inform our staff of the reason for your child's absence. This enables us to keep accurate attendance information for your child.

*If you receive a text message* from the school enquiring into your child's absence, please contact us immediately to inform us of the reason for your child's absence.

*If your child is going to be away for a week or longer* due to a family holiday you are asked to complete the family leave form available in the front office.

*If your child is away for two days or more* due to illness, we ask you to bring in your child's doctor's certificate.

May it be a time where you are able to enjoy each other's company more than usual and live at a steadier, smoother pace. ## Justice, LENT and Easter at Antonio

This week celebrated Easter at Antonio with a liturgy in the gym. This celebration brought to a close for 2021 the discerning time of LENT. A time for reflection, growth and transformation. We listened, wondered, were kind to others, gave to others, planted seeds and watched them grow and reflected on our lives. As part of the Catholic Tradition, we spent some time contemplating with the Stations of the Cross. As we reflected at these stations, we decorated rocks with symbols of our thoughts. We will use the rocks in our redeveloped play space around a friendship seat that the Vinnie's team are planning.

Our Mini Vinnie's Social Justice Team counted the money given at our Community Breakfast, our classroom coin collection and our Cake Stall at the Welcome Night. We raised \$582.50 to send to Caritas Project Compassion which is enough to provide;

- beds in a refugee camp in Bangladesh for an entire family including the elderly grandparents, so they don't have to sleep on the floor
- fabric to make up to 1000 face masks to protect a community during a COVID 19 outbreak in the Solomon Islands
- a COVID 19 prevention kit for one family in a refugee camp
- a chicken that provides eggs for a school in the Solomon Islands.



The cake stall raised \$145 to support our local St Vincent De Paul Conference who will use the money to stock the pantry.

Thank you to the Antonio Catholic School community for supporting these worthy charities with a grand total of \$727.50. You truly have made a difference.
